A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING PERMISSIBLE USES OF THE MONEY IN THE WASTE TIRE
 102 ADMINISTRATION, ENFORCEMENT, MARKET DEVELOPMENT, AND
 103 CLEANUP <u>FUND, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN</u>
 104 <u>APPROPRIATION.</u>

Bill Summary

The bill:

• Repeals a provision allowing the department of public health and environment (department) to use money in the





waste tire administration, enforcement, market development, and cleanup fund (fund) to develop a fire prevention, training, and firefighting plan, hire a consultant to assist in developing the plan, and reimburse the division of fire prevention and control in the department of public safety (division) for its assistance in developing the plan and hiring the consultant; and

• Allows the department to use money in the fund to reimburse the division for inspections of facilities where waste tires are present and for technical assistance and other assistance the division provides to the department or the public related to waste tires.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-20-1404, amend
3	(2)(o); repeal (2)(m); and add (2)(p) as follows:
4	30-20-1404. Waste tire administration, enforcement, market
5	development, and cleanup fund - creation - rules. (2) The department
6	shall use the money in the fund for:
7	(m) In conjunction with the division of fire prevention and control
8	in the department of public safety, developing a model fire prevention,
9	training, and firefighting plan, hiring a consultant to assist in developing
10	the plan, and reimbursing the division of fire prevention and control for
11	its time spent assisting the department in implementing this subsection
12	(2)(m); and
13	(o) Encouraging waste tire market development; AND
14	(p) Reimbursing the division of fire prevention and
15	CONTROL IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR:
16	(I) INSPECTIONS OF FACILITIES WHERE WASTE TIRES ARE PRESENT
17	CONDUCTED BY THE DIVISION TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE WASTE TIRE
18	COLLECTION FACILITIES, WASTE TIRE PROCESSORS, AND WASTE TIRE
19	MONOFILLS ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE RULES PROMULGATED BY THE

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DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-33.5-1203.5 (2);
 AND

3 (II) TECHNICAL AND OTHER ASSISTANCE THE DIVISION PROVIDES
4 TO THE DEPARTMENT OR THE PUBLIC RELATED TO WASTE TIRES,
5 INCLUDING ASSISTANCE RELATED TO:

6 (A) THE DEVELOPMENT OF FIRE PREVENTION EDUCATION
7 MATERIALS; AND

(B) REVIEW OF FIRE PREVENTION PLANS.

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9 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation. (1) For the 2022-23 state fiscal 10 year, \$77,780 is appropriated to the department of public health and 11 environment for use by the hazardous material and waste management 12 division. This appropriation is from the waste tire administration, 13 enforcement, market development, and cleanup fund created in section 14 30-20-1404 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the division may use this 15 appropriation for waste tire program administration and cleanup program 16 enforcement. 17 (2) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$77,780 is appropriated to 18 the department of public safety for use by the department. This

19 <u>appropriation is from reappropriated funds received from the department</u>

20 of public health and environment under subsection (1) of this section. To

21 <u>implement this act, the department may use this appropriation as follows:</u>

22 (a) \$44,680 for use by the division of fire prevention and control

23 for personal services, which amount is based on an assumption that the

24 <u>division will require an additional 0.5 FTE;</u>

25 (b) \$23,433 for use by the division of fire prevention and control

26 <u>for operating expenses; and</u>

27 (c) \$9,667 for vehicle lease payments.

1	(3) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$9,667 is appropriated to the
2	department of personnel. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds
3	received from the department of public safety under subsection (2)(c) of
4	this section. To implement this act, the department of personnel may use
5	this appropriation to provide vehicles to the department of public safety.
6	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
7	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
8	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
