Related Budget Information

The bill is dependent on gifts, grants, and donations for implementation on an accelerated timeline. For accelerated implementation, the bill requires expenditures of \$20,000 in FY 2026-27 if sufficient gifts, grants, and donations are received in FY 2025-26. If the necessary revenue from these sources is not

realized, the implementation will occur on the Department's normal standards review timeline. As amended in the Senate Education Committee, this will be by July 1, 2028 if sufficient money is available or by July 1, 2032.
